- How many other people would this actually include? There's already some overlap with HOF and active IHSGCA members.

- If they pay dues and attend meetings, judges perhaps should have a full voice and voting privileges.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMMENDMENT

Article III

Membership

The Association has four classes of membership:

D. Hall of Fame Membership

1. All persons inducted into the IHSGCA Hall of Fame are eligible for Hall of Fame Membership.

a. They will have a voice in all Association matters.

b. They will have no vote in Association matters.

c. They will have a vote in Hall of Fame matters.

d. Hall of Fame members do not need to attend Association meetings to be eligible to vote on Hall

of Fame matters.

d. They will be considered lifetime members in the Association.

e. Hall of Fame members may serve on Association committees.

f. Annual dues are waived for Hall of Fame members.

 Hall of Fame members and a guest will receive free admission to all Association sponsored functions.

 A Hall of Fame member can nominate himself either verbally or in writing for any committee or activity in

which the member wants to participate.

a. Application is made only to the Secretary-Treasurer.

b. A second is not necessary for self-nomination.

4. As a Hall of Fame member of the Illinois High School Gymnastics Coaches

Association they will be eligible to submit nominees in January for the Hall of Fame

- Purpose: Codifies existing practice as relates to HOF members as an official part of our Constitution.

- Purpose: Clarifies and formalizes HOF member participation rights in association matters.

Proposed: Blaise Blasko Seconded: Scott Phillips (Highlighted is changed wording) CONSTITUTIONAL AMMENDMENT Article XIII Hall of Fame Guidelines for the Illinois High School Gymnastics Coaches Association Hall of Fame. A. Location – Gary Morava Center, Mount Prospect, Illinois. B. Purpose – To recognize the achievement of those people who have contributed to the promotion of Illinois High

School Gymnastics.

C. Categories – Competitors, coaches, judges, and contributors.

D. Criteria:

1. Any member of the Illinois High School Gymnastics Coaches Association will be eligible to submit

nominees.

2. Any member making a nomination will be responsible for writing a resume of the nominee's accomplishments and contributions to Illinois high school gymnastics.

3. All nominees in the coach, judge, or contributor category must have a minimum of five years active

participation in the Illinois high school gymnastics system.

4. All nominees in the competitor category must have completed at least one year in the Illinois high school

gymnastics system.

5. All resumes will be submitted to the Hall of Fame Selection Committee in January for screening, with a

majority vote by the Selection Committee needed to approve the nominees of the membership.

6. An individual nomination is active in the HOF committee for three years.

All resumes should be kept on file indefinitely.

E. Hall of Fame Committee:

1. The selection committee will be composed of six members to serve a term of three years.

2. A chairman will be selected by the committee with a simple majority vote.

3. The Hall of Fame selection committee will review all current nominees.

4. A majority vote by the selection committee is needed to approve current nominees of the membership.

5. A 2/3 vote by the selection committee is needed to reject any nominee of the membership.

6. In February the Hall of Fame committee will meet to review names for the current years ballot.

7. The selection committee will present the nominees to the entire Association at the March meeting.

8. A <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> majority is necessary to be introduced to the selection committee once again for final approval.

9. The number of inductees shall be of a number not to exceed three in any year.

10. Announcements of inductees will be made in conjunction with our annual banquet at the May meeting.

F. Hall of Fame Chairman:

 The chairman will annually update the Hall of Fame members and their personal contact information.

2. At the December meeting the Hall of Fame chairman will review all resumes on file that can be renominated

by the general membership.

3. The second week of April, the Hall of Fame chairman will send out ballots and resumes to all Hall of

Fame members that are not actively coaching at a member school.

4. The ballots must be on colored paper.

5. A stamped, return envelope addressed to the Hall of Fame committee chairman will be sent with the

ballots.

6. Current Hall of Fame members will vote by mail only.

 Current Hall of Fame voting ballots must be returned before the end of IHSA Sectional competition.

8. The chairman will write a formal letter to the individual(s) notifying them of their acceptance into the

IHSGCA Hall of Fame.

9. The chairman will arrange for the HOF member to provide an 11"X14" black and white portrait. He will

frame and place the photograph on the HOF wall at the Morava Center. 10. The chairman will coordinate with the HOF member in ordering a ring. 11. The nominee will pay 50% of the cost toward purchasing the ring. 12. The chairman will send a letter of recognition to the Principal and Athletic Director of the high school in which the inductee coached. G.Hall of Fame Voting: 1. The Hall of Fame steering committee prepares the Hall of Fame ballots. 2. At the end of the April IHSGCA meeting the Secretary-Treasurer will prepare for the Hall of Fame steering committee a full membership list with school names. The list will include current Hall of Fame members that are actively coaching. 3. The Hall of Fame steering committee or their appointee will conduct voting for the Hall of Fame at all sectional host sites. 4. There is no limit on the number of nominees that can get a "yes" vote. 5. All ballots are forwarded to the Hall of Fame chairman and kept separate from the current Hall of Fame member ballots. 6. Using the total number of Full members, tally 75% of this number to determine the votes necessary for induction into the Hall of Fame. 7. The final vote count is made using the "yes" votes from the current Full membership plus all "ves" votes from current Hall of Fame members. 8. Per XIII-E-8 from above the Hall of Fame committee will tally votes and notify in writing the IHSGCA President of the individuals inducted into the IHSGCA Hall of Fame.

9. The Hall of Fame chairman will keep all ballots for one year.

- XIII.G.7 (of the latest draft) is the significant change. Alters the threshold for the HOF votes required.

- Requires "Yes" votes from 65% of: (Reachable HOF members + members of Association)

- HOF Chairman will need to determine if contact info for each HOF member is accurate.

- HOF Chairman will cull the list of HOF members over time if they do not respond or cannot be reached.

- Also defines further roles and expectations of HOF Chairman.

- Largely defines existing expectations that are not documented.

- Note that proxy votes are already an option for members to vote (send their vote in to the Secretary via emai).

Proposed: Ryan Dengel Seconded: Keith Mukai

Article XIII Section D

A candidate will only be approved if he receives a 3/4 majority (75.0% or greater) of all votes cast. Hall of

Fame members' votes will be counted the same as general Association members' votes. The Hall of Fame committee shall count the votes as follows:

• A "Yes" vote for a candidate will be added to the vote count's numerator and denominator.

• A "No" vote for a candidate will be added to the vote count's denominator.

• An "Abstain" or non-vote (neither "Yes" nor "No" were selected) for a candidate will not affect the

outcome.

Example:

Candidate X receives 35 "Yes" votes, 10 "No" votes, with 7 abstaining. The votes are calculated as 35/45 =

77.8% and the candidate is approved for Hall of Fame induction.

Candidate Y receives 20 "Yes" votes, 8 "No" votes, with 8 abstaining. The votes are calculated as 20/28 =

71.4% and the candidate is not approved for Hall of Fame induction.

The Hall of Fame committee shall notify the Association president the result of the votes by \_\_\_\_\_(some

time frame).

#### Discussion:

- If an abstain vote is thrown out, it actually lowers the threshold for reaching approval.

Keith Mukai: I now prefer Blaise's latest version of his vote-counting proposal.
 Get HOF nominees' resumes out to the association sooner so that they aren't trying to make a decision on the spot at Sectionals. April is a possibility. Blaise's proposal recommends the March association meeting.

Changes to State Meet Format:

The following were voted on and pass unanimously to suggest to the IHSA for changes in the State Meet format.

# - Approved by the association in May.

# **Proposal for team finals**

1. All-around groups will be assigned to each of the BYE rotations in the 8 team rotation currently used with the BYES starting first on two of the 4 rotations instead of the present none.

Rationale, it is chosen at random for the team, the AA should also have a feel of randomness to better show the openness of the judging.

2. All-around groups will be assigned in descending ranked order and be assigned each of the 4 slots. The exception being all-arounders from the same team should be in the same rotation for the purpose of safety and saving time so a coach does not have to be on two events at the same time.
