V. National Team Selection Committee

- Discussion over the proposal for a 6 member selection committee (one representative from each conference). If there is a tie the president of the IHSGCA would vote.
- Skip Adamson suggested that coaches submit paperwork at the beginning of the season for any senior that would have a chance to make the National team.
- Skip Adamson brought up concerns about some representatives not voting or not being present during committee meetings.
- Brad Foerch said it would be the responsibility of the committee representative from the conference to
 make sure his recommendations were submitted to the committee. If no names were given that
 conference simply would not be represented in the national team selection committee.
- The vote to change the selection committee will be next week.

New Business

VI.State Meet

- Concerns were voiced in the Feburary meeting about the selection of the state meet site.
- Bill Cordts, contacted Kurt Gibson of the IHSA and he said Barrington High School was the only school aggressively seeking to host the state meet.
- Bill Cordts, contacted Barrington High School about the late start time on Friday. Barrington High School said it was beyond their control and it will be reevaluated next year.
- Bill Cordts, stated that the IHSA delayed selecting a host school until after the 10% rule was defeated by the presidents board.

- The president's board stated that boy's gymnastics would be around for a long time.
- Howie Sokol stated he felt that competing 3 times in 24 hours is a problem.
- Howie Sokol further stated that Barrington could solve the late start problem by having a half day on Friday which would solve any state aid issues.
- It was suggested that the team competition be moved to Thursday to give athletes adequate rest.
